• It enables schools to effectively plan their use of the Primary PE and sport premium

 It helps schools to meet the requirements (as set out in guidance) to publish information on their Primary PE and sport premium

 It will be an effective document to support Ofsted inspections enabling schools to evidence progress in Physical Education (PE) and evidence swimming attainment, which forms part of the PE National Curriculum. We would recommend schools consider the Intent, Implementation and Impact of any spend, as examined within the Education Inspection Framework.

Meeting National Curriculum requirements for swimming and water safety.

What percentage of your current Year 6 cohort can swim competently, confidently and proficiently over a distance of at least 25 metres?	12%	The school used a portable swimming pool which was booked for 4 weeks. Pupils in Year 6 did not receive the planned amount of swimming lessons due staff absence from the providers which had an impact on the number of swimmers who achieved the intended target of 25 metres.
What percentage of your current Year 6 cohort can use a range of strokes effectively [for example, front crawl, backstroke, and breaststroke]?	95%	Pupils showed increased confidence in the pool and demonstrated effective use of a range of strokes during their water confidence lessons.

What percentage of your current Year 6 cohort are able to perform safe self-rescue in different water-based situations?	75%	100 % of pupils have completed water safety activities.

Have you done this?	No	The school did not plan top up lessons, as the planned timetable had up to 2 hours of swimming a week for year 6, but it did not go to plan.

No	The school is presently using external qualified swimming instructors to deliver swimming and safe self-rescue, in the pool. The Year 6 teacher delivers water safety lessons in class.
