We hope you all enjoyed the half term break.

This half term we are looking forward to a range of events, non-more so than **Chaplins' Pantomime** who will be visiting the school on **Thursday 28<sup>th</sup> November** for pupils from **Early Years to Yr.2**, to re-enact the story of **Jack and the Beanstalk**. Alongside the pantomime there will be popcorn and drinks for all, and parents are asked to contribute £3 towards the cost, via ParentPay prior to the performance in school. **December (Yrs. 5 & 6).** The children will have an early lunch in school, in preparation for a 1.30pm performance with a return time of approximately 4.00pm. All the children can though take a small snack and drink to the theatre for the interval.

The website describes this production as a magical re-telling of the tale of Beauty and the Beast, first performed in this version by the Royal Shakespeare Company.

When Beauty's father hears that his long-lost ship packed with pearls has landed safely in harbour, he sets out on a long, difficult journey to claim his fortune and rescue his family from poverty. But, when, stumbling across a magic world belonging to a fearsome beast, he picks a rose as a present for his favourite daughter, the family find themselves in a nightmarish predicament from which only Beauty can rescue them...

While the visit has been subsidised, we are asking parents to contribute £15 towards the cost of the visit. This is payable via ParentPay and will need to be paid in full by Friday 13<sup>th</sup> December 2024. If this proves to be difficult for any families, please speak to a member of the Admin team who can set up a payment plan over the remaining five weeks.

#### Attendance

Under plans to be unveiled by Ofsted and Bridget Phillipson, the Education Secretary, pupil attendance will now be among 10 new performance ratings upon which schools will be judged. Thank you to everyone who has supported their child, and the school, by ensuring at least 'good' attendance this half term. Please take a look at the table below to see expected levels of attendance over the academic year, and the impact of regular absences on a child's level of attainment.

Following this half term's analysis there are children already at risk of underachieving! While letters have gone out to parents alerting them to our early concerns, this will be followed up with more formal meetings where applicable. For some, attendance below expectations is due to regular days off, but for others it is term time leave that is impacting significantly on a child's learning opportunities and overall attendance. We published term time dates at the beginning of this academic year and urge parents to adhere to the school's holiday periods. Please look at the table below and consider how your child's attendance relates to their class and his/her peers.
